She will work under the supervision of Joshua Tree National Park employees in the Science and Resource Stewardship division and will perform a mix of fieldwork, data entry, information compilation, and scientific research. Biology Professor Dr. Paul Delaney shared, "This is a great opportunity for her to network with environmental professionals and study in Joshua Tree National Park".

Minerva Hamilton Hoyt was one of Pasadena Garden Club's most esteemed members, and is credited for being instrumental in the establishment of Joshua Tree National Park. The internship honors her legacy by promoting environmental quality through educational programs and actions in the fields of conservation and civic improvement.
